Township Day March 8th, 2022

Election begins the day, polls are open 10am-8pm. Incumbent Linda Hass filed for clerk and incumbent Dennis Haubenschild filed for supervisor, as of printing of newsletter no one else has filed. Elections close at 8pm. Ballots will be counted by election judges. **The meeting begins:** Clerk will open the annual meeting around 8:15 pm. Then the electors choose a moderator to conduct the meeting. The moderator must state the order of business, it is common for the clerk to prepare an agenda for the annual meeting. Supervisors can participate as citizens in the annual meeting and provide information, but the townboard does not run the meeting. **Reports:** 1) The board of Audit report must be read at the meeting. At least 30 minutes before the annual meeting the clerk must post the financial report that was approved by the Board of Audit. 2) A written road report must be provided, but there is no requirement to read it. 3) Townships may have other reports that may be of interest to the members: Townhall, Garbage and Refuse, Cemetery, or Fire. **Parliamentary Procedure:** While no particular procedure is required for town board meetings. The annual meeting is different, the Annual meeting is required to use parliamentary procedures. **Electors:** Any member of the public can attend the Annual Meeting, only those eligible to vote in the township election may cast a vote or act on motions at the meeting. Only town residents may vote—landowners who do not reside in township cannot vote. A person eligibility to vote may be challenged by any resident, validity of challenge is determined by election judges. Electors decide how to cast votes, be it by voice, show of hands, or paper ballot. **Town Levy & Much More:** The main reason of the annual town meeting is to vote on the town levy—the tax rate that residents pay for the local services, like road and bridges. The electors provide “authorization,” but the Townboard will decide whether to use the powers given to them and decide all spending matter. In addition, the electors at the annual town meeting may **vote to:** establish, alter or vacate a road. Provide Fire Protection, the electors may vote for the Township to provide for Fire Protection, including approving the amount of money to be raised for this purpose. **Donate, or not to Donate:** a frequently asked question about whether donations can be made at the annual town meeting, the short answer is No. Town residents may indicate a preference on whether money is spent, but only the townboard is empowered to spend the towns money. **Set the Meeting Time:** The voters or townboard may set the time for the annual town meeting. The meeting cannot take place between 6 pm and 8 pm for towns conducting March elections. **Confirm Meeting Place:** Set the location for next Annual meeting. **To Adjourn or Continue Meeting:** The voters may adjourn the meeting, or if they want to return later in the year to finish the meeting, they may continue the annual meeting. To continue the meeting, the voters must approve a motion to continue that includes dates, time and location that the meeting will resume. If voters feel that all business is completed then the Annual Meeting can be adjourned. **Meeting Minutes:** The clerk must take the meeting minutes if present, if not present, the voters can elect a clerk for the meeting. The clerk and the moderator of the meeting must sign the minutes of the meeting.

Roads

The supervisors do an annual road tour. During their tour they drive each township road to determine which roads need the most attention. They check on signs, gravel, tar, culverts, road right of way and weeds. Clearing of road right away will continue to be done as in previous years to maintain safe visibility and road right of way.

Hazardous Waste Disposal

Inter-county hazardous waste disposal agreement has been extended between Isanti County and Chisago County. In order to use the program, residents of Isanti County need to fill out the Household Hazardous Waste Voucher, which can also be found on the county website listed below. The form asks for a resident's name, address, and the month they plan to visit the facility, as well as a list of the acceptable items of which they plan to dispose. The voucher can be brought to the Isanti County Zoning Office, scanned to the office, or emailed to erica.wilson@co.isanti.mn.us for authorization before using the facility.

Hazardous waste generated by a business will not be accepted. A list of items that are accepted at the facility can be found on the Chisago County website.
