Township Day March 10th, 2020

The day begins at 10am when elections open at the town hall. This year you will be voting for clerk and one supervisor. Elections close at 8pm.

The annual meeting will start around 8:15pm. The clerk will open the meeting. A moderator is elected by the citizens to conduct the meeting.

Any member of the public can attend the annual town meeting, but only those eligible to vote in the township election may cast a vote or act on motions. Owners of land within the township, who do not reside there, cannot vote at the annual town meeting.

Township Government

Township unit of government is found primarily in NE and N Central United States and most of Canadian provinces.

It is a subdivision of a county. Townships usually have 36 sections.

Townships embody the values of "Grassroots Government." In townships, citizens contribute their talents, skills and ideas to preserve the quality of life and to deliver important programs and services. Township officials live in the communities they serve and stay in touch with ever changing needs.

There are 20 states in the United States that have townships

Township functions vary widely but the major services most commonly performed are maintenance of local roads and administration of public assistance.

Roads

The supervisors do an annual road tour. During their tour they drive each township road to determine which roads need the most attention. They check on Signs, Gravel, Tar, Culverts, Road Right of Way and Weeds. This year the township plans on doing chip sealing over all the tar township rd. Clearing of road right away will continue to be done as in previous years to maintain safe visibility and road right away.

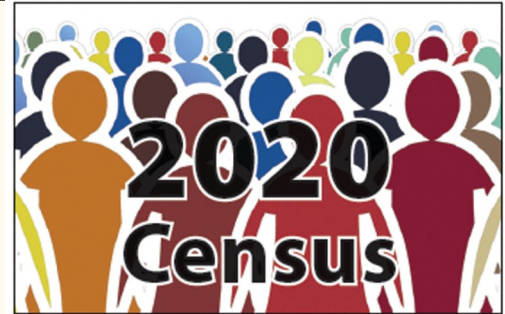
