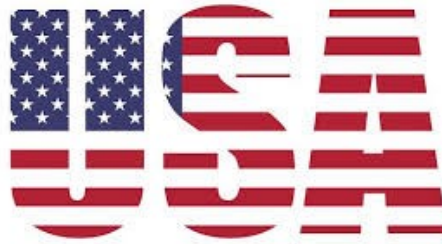

Roads

The supervisors do an annual road tour. During their tour they drive each township road to determine which roads need the most attention. They check on Signs, Gravel, Tar, Culverts, Road Right of Way and Weeds. This year the township plans on doing chip sealing over all the tar township rd. Clearing of road right away will continue to be done as in previous years to maintain safe visibility and road right away.

Grant Received to Improve Green Lake!

The Isanti Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) has been awarded a 16-year grant to improve the health of Green Lake, one of Wyanett Township's most significant recreational center points.

The grant program has a goal of removing Green Lake from the State's Impaired Waters list. Yahoo! That means better fishing and swimming opportunities for all!

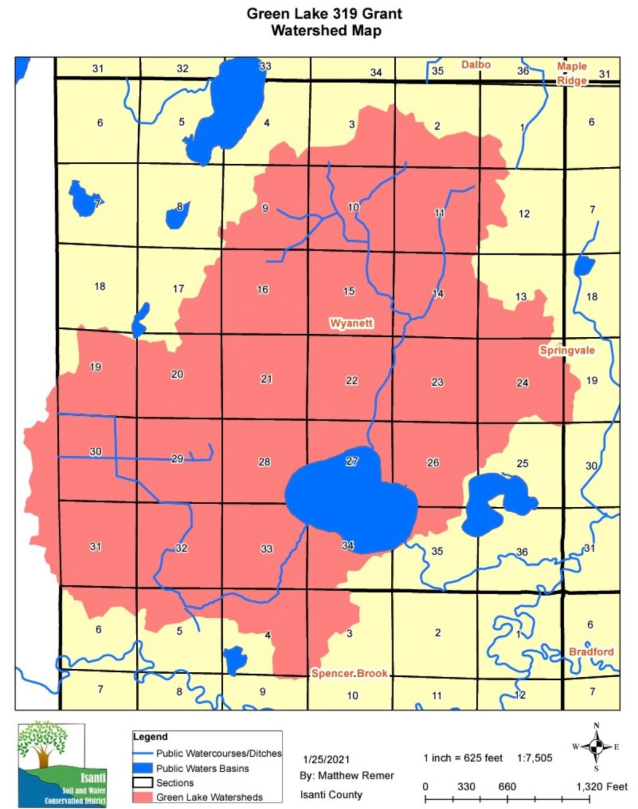
So, what's the plan? Over the next 10-16 years the SWCD will put extra effort into improving the health of Green Lake. The first phase of the grant includes \$284,000 to do projects that will have a direct impact on the lake. The grant requires a 40% match (\$185,926); the match will come from the Green Lake Improvement District, SWCD State funding, private funding, and landowners.

The projects will be targeted to both residential and agricultural landowners- that's where you come in. We can't do this without a little bit of help from many people (small actions add up).

If you own agricultural land: In most cases our program can cover 100% of the cost to install a conservation project. The projects that we can fund include cover crops, filter strips, grassed waterways, water and sediment control basins, wetland restorations and reduced till/no-till.

We understand that many farmers are incorporating conservation practices into their farming program already. - TV's, Computer Monitors, 19" and Under.....\$25.00
