We are planning on having the block party. Hot Dogs, chips, water, lemonade and paper products furnished. Please bring a dish or desert to share with everyone.


Roads

Please consider updating your mail box to a swing away style. (Pictured below) these can be purchased threw Isanti county hwy dept by calling 689-1870. All new construction is requesting it and we would like to encourage this style. It makes it easier to push snow back behind the mailbox, which also makes it easier for mail carriers and you to receive mail. Supervisor Travis wood would be glad to assist you with this process (763 286 6784). The post and hardware comes as a kit. (App. \$100) please locate for utilities in the Right of Way by calling 811. If you have not received a blue address sign or it has been damaged please notify us also. Please keep garbage cans out of Right of Way also. Even with the mailbox post is a good setback.





DO NOT PUT SNOW ON THE ROAD. Pushing snow across the road or in to the road is illegal. Please refrain from piling snow in the Right of Way. The big piles are hard on equipment. We strive to keep the road clear as possible in a timely fashion. According to the MN/DOT, depositing snow in any fashion onto a public street or highway is illegal and punishable as a misdemeanor under **MN Statute 160.27** and various local ordinaces which prohibit plowing, shoveling, blowing or placing snow onto public roadways.
