Dalbo Fire Dept. fundraised and received grants for \$208,000 last year. We are always looking for ways to save the taxpayers money. DFD does several fundraisers and open house events throughout the year. As a fire dept. we enjoy inviting and interacting with our citizens at our fundraisers and open house events.
