At the annual meeting, the township financial report will be posted and read, road report will be read and discussed. Once again, I want to thank the citizens of Wyanett township for your continued support. We are a volunteer dept. trying to do the best we can with the funding and resources we have available to us. Dalbo Fire Dept. is one of two depts. that cover Wyanett township; Princeton Fire being the other covering the southwest portion of the township. DFD responding calls include fire calls, car accidents, rescue calls and assists with medical calls for both Allina and North ambulance. DFD is made up of 18 members and are currently looking to recruit firefighters; if interested, contact us by phone 763 689 9801 or Facebook. Check out MNFIREHIRE also to get more info. We are always looking for ways to save the taxpayers money. DFD does several fundraisers and open house events throughout the year. As a fire dept we enjoy inviting and interacting with our citizens at our fundraisers and open house events. Please consider attending our list of events at the Dalbo Fire Dept.; Picture Day with the Easter bunny (early march), 10 a.m.- 1200 p.m. Pancake breakfast and vendor show, July 12, 8 a.m., Bingo Oct 10th, 530 p.m. and Santa picture day in early December. Please look on our website for updates (Dalbofire.org). Wyanett national night out event in August we try to have something fun for the kids also. Look for the updated details on Facebook. Please consider bringing your aluminum cans to our bin at the Dalbo Fire Hall for our recycling fundraiser. DFD Bingo Night is during fire prevention week; we give out some fire extinguishers and smoke alarms during the fundraiser to promote fire safety. This is a good week to check/change the batteries in your smoke alarms and press the test button. Smoke alarms expire every 10 years so check the date also. I encourage you to go over fire escape plans, safe locations to meet in case of a house fire; the get out stay out plan, stop drop and roll, never play with fire, stay below the smoke, never hide from firefighters and how to call 911 with kids. Dalbo fire is always looking for vehicles to train on for extrication training. If you have a vehicle to donate you can contact Travis 763-286-6784. We also are looking for an old house to use for training purposes as well. DFD would like to extend a special thank you to the Wyanett board for being so supportive of the first responding services. Wyanett town board has provided building space and a LUCAS device to ensure quicker response times and quality CPR when needed by Wyanett residents.
